Mounted Assistance Unit (MAU) Program Update



The MAU are looking forward to a busy 2017 season, based off the diverse, productive activities of 2016. The main purpose of the MAU is to patrol the trails on horseback and to promote the safety of all the park users by reporting

park conditions. In 2016, the units have put in over 4,500 patrol hours on horseback, 600 volunteer ground hours, 200 training hours and additional hours for administration and monthly meetings.

In addition to patrolling, listed below are the diverse activities of 2016, all on horseback:

- 26 four hour training sessions for the MAU members.
- Three Recertification Certification Trainings for the MAU members.
- One Multi Unit MAU Training held at Marshall Canyon, fondly named the 'Mosh Pit' practice.
- Two Antonovich Rides, which the MAU co-hosted and sponsored.
- 5. ETI Convention and Horse Show at LAEC patrolling the stables and grounds.
- Whittier Narrows all night patrol for fishing with Santa Event at the lake.
- Covina Christmas Parade.

8. All the Units ended the year with their individual Christmas parties (non-horseback, lol).

The MAU's have had a wonderful year and look forward to all the events we can be of service to in 2017. I appreciate all the dedication and service of these wonderful horse people.



AHC to Offer Student Internships Starting in 2017!

In 2017, the American Horse Council (AHC) will begin offering three different internship programs available to both high school and college students. Students will be eligible to apply to one internship per year in the AHC Internship Program.

Also starting in 2017 is the addition of a Student Membership to the AHC Membership categories. The AHC felt it was important to continue the trend of being able to educate youth of the importance of the AHC in order to ensure the industry's long-term sustainability. The internship opportunities being offered in 2017 are another way for students to understand exactly what it is the AHC does here in Washington, DC, and educate the next generation to advocate on behalf of the industry at the local, state or national level.

The three internships available are:

• 1 or 2 week shadowing program to gain a broader understanding of the AHC with a focus on expanding knowledge of equine industry and policymaking. Transportation and housing not included; stipend of \$250 available to offset expenses. Open to high school

and college students.

- 1 or 2 month internship- includes overview of AHC, student would conduct a research project and write a white paper on a specific topic of interest for academic credit. Transportation and housing not included; stipend of \$500/month available to offset expenses. Open to college students.
- Semester internship- includes overview of AHC, research project and white paper for academic credit and attendance at annual AHC meeting. Transportation and housing not included; Stipend of \$500/month available to offset expenses. Open to college students.



I got in touch with Amber through the phone number Crystal had given me, and she was so kind about my desire to see Shar and talk to her. My husband and I planned a trip to New Mexico from Texas just to see

They were so generous and thoughtful, and within four months, they said it was time. I was having some back surgery and couldn't get to her for a short period. They kept her for me. My wonderful husband and son took the time to drive to New Mexico and bring home my dream...

Shar is so much like her mother, and I had her mother for over twenty five years. It is just wonderful to see her relax and enjoy life.

Thank you for listening to my story. It has been wonderful having Shar home, and I plan on taking good care of her from now on.



It's TRAP! What is "TRAP" you ask? TRAP is ETI's Trail Rider Award Program!



What does it do? A heck of a lot more than it sounds!

If you have any questions about the TRAP Program, call TRAP Chairperson Carol Elliott, (760) 963-8209. All completed logs and CHECKS should be sent to Carol Elliott: 6990 Ord View Rd; Apple Valley Ca 92308. happy2appy@yahoo.com

All your TRAP dues of \$6.00 are due in January.

ETI TRAP keeps computerized logs on how many hours members are riding and where.

In this day and age, when trails are giving way to housing developments, it is crucial that records be kept on trail usage.

ETI Corrals in all areas are finding themselves having to defend their riding areas more and more against encroaching civilization. On several occasions, TRAP records have been instrumental in maintaining trail access.

When a Corral calls ETI TRAP and identifies a specific problem area, TRAP not only provides them with actual riding statistics of usage, but TRAP members are notified to increase usage and support in that particular area.

Documentation from 'trail logs' turned in by TRAP members are proof that trails are being used by equestrians.


ETI TRAP acknowledges hours in the saddle with shoulder patches and pins that can be attached almost anywhere.

Lest we offend the "cart" people, TRAP also counts those non-arena hours of driving time spent on the trails

How much does all this cost? It's cheap!!! The fee to join TRAP is only \$12.00 (you must maintain current ETI membership); then the TRAP membership is maintained each year for only \$6.00.

You will start by receiving the TRAP main shoulder patch (about the size of a police patch), and your log sheets. As you hit the hour goals (100, 200, 500, etc.), additional patches will be sent to you. When you reach the higher levels, your hours will be acknowledged with pins instead of patches.

Why should the Show people get all the awards?












expense was paid for by Pony Cross Farm.





averaging between two and three hours, with trail obstacles also consists of a trail ride, usually obstacles along the way. Obstacles are natural, or simulate naturally occurring
