

Mounted Assistance Unit (MAU) Program Update





Corral 66 at Sawtooth Campground

ETI Corral 66 out of Barstow recently got the chance to introduce a group of "city kids" to horses. On March 26, several of us loaded up our horses and headed off to Sawtooth Campground about 8 miles south of Barstow. When we arrived we chatted with the campers that were there and unloaded the horses. We then led the horses around the 1/4 mile loop that we would be leading the kids around. Our route included walking out on a gravel road and walking back through the desert. Once everyone was familiar with the route we tied the horses back at the trailers and waited for kids to arrive.

A short time later the City of Barstow's transit bus arrived with twelve children ages 8 to 12 years old, several parent volunteers and Jane Laraman-Brockhurst the Coordinator for the Bureau of Land Management's Desert Discovery Kid's Program. It was a beautiful desert morning, not too hot, not too cold and not too windy. The kids bounced down the steps of the bus obviously excited about their day.

We were able to herd the children over to a ring of rocks where they were able to sit and watch. We knew they wouldn't remember our names, but we did tell them the horses' names. We told them that the Paint's name was "Scout", the white pony was "Candy", the Appaloosa was "Summer" and Haflinger with the blond mane was "Misty". They remembered all of the horses names the first time! We then talked about how important horses are in our country's history and how horses can go barefoot, wear metal shoes or slip-on boots. They learned about the parts of the horse and even got to label the different parts of a horse on the magnetic board. We finished by talking about how horses are big, but they can be fearful because they are prey animals.



Since there were four horses and twelve students, each horse was assigned 3 "riders". Most of the kids had never ridden a horse except for pony rides at the fair, but now they were getting to help groom the horses and watch

saddled up close. Then the first group of students put on their helmets and were helped up into the saddles. We led all four horses around the pre-determined route. Some of the kids were apprehensive for the first few steps. It took time for some of them to relax and feel the rhythm of the horses walk, but once they did their faces just lit up!



The entire event lasted just under two hours. We hope we inspired a least one child to someday become a horse owner or at least appreciate horses. I'll admit it is a bit stressful when you have other people's children, but it was so worth it, and we are already making plans to do it again next year!



All of them returned Sunday to judge or help. It truly takes dozens of volunteers to put on a Trail Trial. I insist my judges have competed in Trail Trials themselves and try to provide a helper for each.



Our obstacles were the tack check and pick left front hoof judged by Tawna Born. Pam Witte gave the instructions for both obstacle #1 and #2.



Since riders were already on the ground they led (not judged because of the closeness of the obstacles and we wanted it to flow smoothly) to the permanent big tire and 18 mounted for Diane Garton.



After riding on the dedicated trail our log branch drag was judged by Sharon Boyle with her husband George helping. The next obstacle was pushing a horizontal yucca branch that had fallen between two juniper trees. For safety reasons we decided to use a noodle instead of a yucca. This was judged by Debra Mader with Dan Cotten helping.



Crossing Barrel Springs Road riders came to our downhill judged by Leah Frankenberg assisted by Kathy Rush. Close by was a Joshua tree with several fallen branches to step over judged by Erin Seem and her helper Erin Collins.

Sunday, May 15, 11am: SHUTTLE VEHICLES TO BISHOP

Tuesday, May 17: Drive to Taboos Creek Campground. 17.5 miles. Charge will be \$3 per person per night. We will be crossing Hwy 395 and will arrange for CHP cover. It is critical that everyone listen to directions so our crossing both times is without incident.

Our May 3rd Corral meeting featured Dr. Richard Stevens presenting the "Coneio Valley Equine News Hour." The talk was in an informative news format that covering the most current and important topics in the equine industry. Topics included why deworming recommendations are changing due to rapidly

increasing resistance, vaccine recommendations for competition horses, new therapies for joint injuries, state of the art treatments for tendon injuries, drug shortages and rapidly rising costs, and new lab tests that rapidly decreasing testing times.



Today Tobe and I joined a dozen members of Equestrian

Trails Corral 36 for their Spring Fling ride at the Malibu Creek State Park, over 7,000 acres of nature in the center of the Santa Monica Mountains. We did a ride of 5.56 miles in 2.5 hours, a



leisurely stroll through the Reagan Ranch and the Udell Gorge, passing through the Goat Buttes, once the hunting grounds of the Golden Age millionaires.

Running along the edge of the park is Mulholland Drive, once the route the elite traveled to this idyllic spot for rural recreation. Now the famous Drive is beloved by weekend warrior motorcyclists, who revel in its curves and twists. Ronald Reagan had a ranch here from 1957-67 [called Yearling Row], and some of the buildings remain. The trail through his former acres is called the Yearling Trail, and old pens and fencing testify to ranching times.



This is one of the doors of the original Reagan Ranch barn. Once he became governor he deeded the property to the State, and it later became part of the larger Park property, preserved for posterity now as wild space.

The landscape is quite dramatic, and trails wind back and forth throughout. Some are reserved only for equestrians and hikers, while bicyclists are allowed on others.

The mighty sandstone outcroppings that form the Goat Buttes on the Backbone Trail always seem like something from another world to me, like a gorge in China. Seeking a rural setting in which to enjoy the outdoors, a group of wealthy Los Angeles businessmen formed the Crags Country Club in 1900 and bought 2,000 acres along Malibu Creek that would later become the nucleus of Malibu Creek State Park.



Layer after layer of mountains reveal themselves as you walk through the trails.

In 1903, the Crags Country Club built a 50' dam in Malibu Creek, creating a 7- acre lake as their private duck hunting and trout fishing preserve. It was later renamed Century Lake by 20th Century Fox Studios when they bought the property and began filming on it.

Looking closely, you can see redwoods at the base of the buttes, their 100+ years of growth now threatened by The rest drought. of the landscape is flourishing in the current El Niño weather, but the redwoods have been hard hit and are distinctly brown.



Heading back, we looked down into the

valley, a bit of Shangri-La attesting to why the name Malibu is known world-wide as the playground of the rich and famous.

So what is actually happening to our bodies during the hours we spend in the saddle? To really understand this, you need to know that most of the muscles in our bodies work in opposing pairs. For instance, when you extend your leg from the knee, your guadriceps muscles on the front of your thigh are shortening, while your hamstrings behind your thigh are lengthening. It's also important to realize that when muscles remain in a shortened position for an extended period of time they become tight, and similarly, muscles kept in a lengthened position can become overly stretched and even weak.

So when we sit in the saddle, which muscles are shortened and potentially made tight? Well, the main one to consider is the hip flexor. That's the muscle that extends your leg forward from your hip and is located at the very top and front of your thigh. In fact, it is shortened even when you sit in a chair or in your car and can be tight for many people. The other leg muscle that can be shortened is the hamstring, which is really a group of three muscles located behind your thigh running from the buttocks to the back of the knee. It's the muscle that begins every step you take.

This muscle bends your knee, and so is also made tight by daily living, just like the hip flexor. The third muscle group that is affected particularly by riding is the hip abductors at your outer hip where the leg joins the torso. These muscles move your legs apart and away from the midline of the body. So when you sit in the saddle, your leg is forward of the hip, your knee is bent, and your legs are wide! You can see how these three groups of muscles are unnaturally shortened and can become tight.

One caveat to this analysis is if you are a bareback rider, in which case you still have all of these same conditions, but you are also over-utilizing your hip adductors, or inner thigh muscles. The constant squeezing of the legs into the horse to stay on when riding bareback (assuming you do more than mosey around at a slow walk) can make these muscles tight as well.

So what can we do about this situation? Well, there are several yoga stretches that can be useful to combat these tight muscles. I'll describe these for the right side, but of course you should do both sides, holding each stretch for 60-90 seconds.

The first is a Kneeling Lunge for the hip flexors. In this stretch, you position your right knee directly over your ankle and your left knee as far back on the floor as possible, looking to achieve a 45-degree angle between the left thigh and the floor. You want to gently press your right upper



thigh forward and downward, keeping the front knee stable over the ankle.



For the hamstrings there are many stretches, but the most simple is Head-to-Knee pose. For this one you begin seated on the floor with your left leg extended straight in front of you and the sole of your right foot against your left inner thigh, right knee to floor. Then fold forward over your extended left leg, reaching your hands for your left foot.



The hip abductor group (outer thigh) also has many option, but I will show you Cradle the Baby. Sit with your left leg extended on the floor in front of you and place your right ankle on top of that leg just above the knee. Then draw your left knee up until it is bent about 90 degrees. Your right knee will remain turned out towards the floor, and you will lift up your entire spine as if you were making yourself taller, taking care not to round the back. A more advanced version of this stretch gives the pose its name, in which you might cradle the right knee in the crook of your right elbow and the right foot in the crook of your left elbow, however if done improperly or too intensely this can lead to knee strain, so just stick with the basics for now.




The fourth stretch that may benefit horseback riders is Butterfly, for the inner thigh muscles. Sit on the floor with the soles of your feet together and the outer edges of your feet on the floor. Take care not to pull your feet in too close to your body, thus over bending the knees. Holding on to your feet, sit up very tall and then fold forward from your hips, bringing your nose toward your feet and using your elbows to press the knees down toward the floor. This particular stretch can be alternated several times with Cradle the Baby to help keep the muscles around the hips balanced.



Do these yoga poses, or stretches, especially after you ride, when the muscles are at their tightest?

FOOD FOR THOUGHT

Albert Einstein wrote, "If you judge a fish by its ability to climb a tree, it will spend its whole life believing that it is stupid." As well, if you train a horse for sophisticated athletic performances with simplistic training techniques, the horse will spend his whole life struggling

with performances for which he is not athletically prepared.

Einstein also reflected, "Everything should be made as simple as possible but not simpler." Most equestrian theories are simpler counting on the horse's talent to compensate for the inaptness of the horse's education. The outcome of course is lameness. Instead, why not enhance the horse's talent and also propensity to remain sound upgrading riding and training techniques to actual knowledge of the equine physiology?

The answer is a course which is not about making the horse do it, but instead how the horse does it. When a performance is thought in terms of optimal muscular development and coordination, the outcome is not only preserving soundness, but also restoring soundness.

Repetitive abnormal stress causes injury, and correcting the root cause of the abnormal stress is the most efficient therapy. "The gait abnormality created by a specific lesion is the gait abnormality that causes the lesion."

There is only one syllable between simple and simpler, and without adequate knowledge simple is simpler.

We do not pretend that the horse's biological mechanism is simple, but it can be clearly explained. We do not pretend that riding efficiently is simple, but it can be learned. We do not pretend that reeducating a horse is simple. Accepting the complexity of a problem is a decisive step toward resolving it. In most instances, a horse can be reeducated if we move away from the riding and training principles that created the problem.

The horse will suffer if we don't have a sound understanding of the horse's functional anatomy and therefore, the ability to prepare the horse's physique for the athletic demand of the performance.

Recently, on a busy Saturday morning, I was informed that



there was a film crew on and around the Mariposa Bridge. Almost always I am notified in advance of any filming plans in the Park and send out an email blast about it to the equestrian public. Since I had not been notified of this filming, I assumed that it was not permitted and that the crew was poaching the area illegally.

When you encounter film making in the Park, as the people on the bridge Saturday, call the Rangers and ask if a permit has been given for this activity. Even if they claim that is it permitted, it is best to double check.

Anytime you see illegal dumping, cars being driven on the trail, accidents or injuries or weird sexual activity, be sure and call the Rangers at (323) 644-6661. Riders and hikers in the park who have cell phones should have the Rangers' phone number on their phone.

I received a report of a drone being flown at a low level out of Bette Davis Park. According to reports, it came very close to an equestrian riding on the trail, causing the horse to spook and bolt. The rider was not thrown.

Another report was at a Hollywood Off Leash dog park where a drone flew directly at a dog and struck it in the face, causing injuries to the dog.

Again, call the Rangers on an incident like this. We are the eyes and ears for the Rangers.

There will be a DeAnza Expedition Celebration in Griffith Park on May 14, 2016. Re-enactment mounted riders will parade in costumes of the period with colorful banners. The ride will be from LAEC area on the dirt trail that runs along Zoo Drive to end at Crystal Springs picnic grounds. All interested equestrians are welcome to join the ride with them. Tentatively scheduled to depart at 10am.

2. Liability Release.

In consideration for Equestrian Trials, Inc. ("ETI") allowing me or my child to voluntarily participate in its activities, and LAEC Incorporated allowing me or my child to participate in events on its grounds, I agree as follows:

- A. This agreement, waiver and release applies to ETI and to ETI's affiliated Corrals, committees, employees, predecessors, successors, attorneys, insurers, members and volunteers who are working in the course and scope of their duties on behalf of ETI, including its affiliated Corrals, at the time of occurrence of any act or omission which is later alleged to be a cause or contribution to a claim for injury, damages or death, and also applies to LAEC Incorporated, its agents and employees (collectively "Released Parties");
- B. I forever release, hold harmless and indemnify Released Parties from liability for any and all claims, demands, causes of action, damages, injuries or death to me, my minor children, my horse and my property, and legal liability of every nature, including the negligent acts or omissions of any Released Parties, whether known or unknown, anticipated or unanticipated, direct or indirect, arising out of participation in the past, present or future ETI activities (including equestrian activities, such as the riding, use of, or being near, horses, whether at an arena, stable or on a trail ride in association with ETI) and I assume all risks of injury or death as set forth in this release;
- C. I shall not bring any lawsuit, action or proceeding against any Released Parties, even if they engage in negligent conduct; and
- D. I make this agreement, waiver and release for and on behalf of myself, my spouse, my child and/or ward, heirs, administrators, successors, representatives and assigns.

3. Activity Risk.

I understand that some ETI activities take place in isolated or wilderness areas over rough terrain, and/or trails of unknown condition, and others take place on land or in facilities owned and managed by others from whom such land or facilities are borrowed or rented. I understand that the organizers, workers and members involved in ETI activities are not professionals in the horse industry, or in the planning or conducting of trips or camping events, or in other areas of expertise involved in ETI activities. I also understand that horseback riding is a rugged adventure, recreational sport activity. I am aware that there are numerous obvious and non-obvious inherent risks of serious injury or death, or property damage, to me or my horse, which are always present in ETI activities, on or near horses. I understand that pregnant women are specifically advised not to ride horses. I understand that ETI is a non-profit club of private individuals who have come together to support and enjoy recreation-oriented activities.





4. Nature of Horse.

I understand that no horse is completely safe, and the Released Parties make no representations or guarantees regarding the safety, training or suitability of any horse. Horses are 5 to 15 times larger, 20 to 40 times more powerful, and 3 to 4 times faster than a human. If I fall from a horse to the ground, it will generally be at a distance of 4 to 6 feet, and the impact will injure me. A horse may divert from its training and act according to its natural survival instincts and may abruptly change directions or speed, trip, slip, fall, stop short, shift its weight, buck, rear, kick, bite, spook, or run from what it perceives to be danger if it is frightened or provoked, or for no reason whatsoever.

5. Conditions of Nature & Locations.

I agree that the Released Parties are not responsible for acts, occurrences or elements of nature or a particular location that can injure a person or scare a horse, cause it to trip, fall or react in some other manner. These elements include thunder, lightening, rain, wind, wild and domestic animals, insects, other people and horses, and reptiles which may walk, run, fly near, bite and/or sting a horse or person, irregular footing on groomed or wild land which is subject to constant change according to weather, temperature, natural and man-made objects. The Released Parties have not inspected, and make no representations or warranties concerning the safety or condition of, any trail, camping site, arena and/or other location of ETI events.

6. <u>Helmet Warning</u>.

I am aware that protective head gear which meets or exceeds the quality standards of the SEI certified and ASTM standard F1163 equestrian helmet, should be purchased and worn by me and/or my child while riding and being near horses, and the wearing of such helmet may reduce the severity of some head injuries and may prevent my serious injury or death as a result of a fall or other occurrence. If I or my minor child do not wear a helmet, it is because we so choose.

SECTION I – GENERAL RULES

1. **ENTRIES** – Pre-Entries must either be postmarked no later than June 10 or entered on-line by June 15. Entries received or postmarked after June 10 or entered on-line by June 15 will be applied at the Post Entry price. For open checks received with a Pre-Entry, classes may be added at the show for the Pre-Entry fee as long as the majority of the classes were pre-entered.

Entry Changes Care should be taken to enter the proper classes. Exhibitors are responsible for their errors and those of their agents in completing the entry forms. **Entry fees from scratched classes will not be refunded.** This applies to open checks as well. Entry fees from a scratched class may be applied to an added class.

- 2. REFUNDS Absolutely no refunds will be made without presentation of a physician's or veterinarian's written certificate of the inability of the rider or horse to compete. The attending physician or veterinarian must sign the certificate. Full refunds less a \$15 service charge will be given if request and documentation is provided prior to June 17. Stall fees, office fees and drug fees will not be refunded after the start of the show. Entry fees from scratched classes will not be refunded. Refunds will be made to exhibitors in any class canceled due to lack of entries. Refund requests after the start of the show must be applied for at the horse show office. No refunds will be given at the show. The respective committee chairpersons must authorize all refunds. Refunds will be mailed after June 30.
- <u>LUNGING</u> Will only be permitted before 7:00am and 30 minutes after the last class of the day. <u>There will absolutely</u> be no lunging in warm-up arenas during show.
- 4. EQUESTRIAN TRAILS, INC. (ETI) HORSE SHOW RULES are patterned after the United States Equestrian Federation (USEF) rules, but ETI management and ETI High Point rules prevail. This is an OPEN horse show; you do not have to be a member to ride in classes. The ETI National Horse Show and Convention (NHS&C) is open to all breeds. Registered horses must be able to show Registration Papers in specified breed classes; otherwise, classes are open to nonregistered equines. All competitors must sign a waiver/release (if under 18 competitors need parent or guardian's signature-NOT trainer). It is the responsibility of the person wishing to compete at the rate of ETI member to make sure their membership is paid and current.
- 5. **FOR SHOW PURPOSES** The age of the exhibitor on December 1 of any year will be maintained throughout the next year. Exhibitors born on December 1 shall assume the greater age of the year.
- 6. <u>SHOWING OF STALLIONS</u> A junior (under 18) may not exhibit or handle a stallion of any age.

- 7. DRUGS AND MEDICATION ETI NHS&C drugging regulations require the exhibitor to advise the show management of all drugs administered within 72 hours prior to or during the event. This information shall be written on a drug form and attached to the entry form in the show office. The name, date, time, and amount of each drug administered shall be listed. Forms for this purpose will be available at the Horse Show office. The \$5 California State drug fee per horse will be collected at the time of the entry.
- 8. **DISQUALIFICATION** Violations of California State Statute of drugging regulations will result in disqualification and forfeiture of fees and prizes. At management's determination, the use of illegal drugs or substances administered by contestants, trainers or assistants, or abuse of animals will result in disqualification from the show and removal from the grounds, as well as forfeiture of fees and prizes. At management's determination, intoxication of contestants or bystanders may result in disqualification from the show and removal from the grounds.
- PROTESTS A protest must be filed as set forth in USEF rules, and will be accompanied with \$50.00 cash or money order.
- 10. RESPONSIBILITY All entries are accepted with the understanding that. ETI their officers, employees, NHS&C show officials, and the Los Angeles Equestrian Center (LAEC) will not be held responsible for any loss, damage, or injury to any horse exhibited or any article of any kind. All horses shall be under the control and direction of the Show Committee but solely at the risk of the exhibitor, who will be responsible for any loss, damage, or injury to any person, animal owned, exhibited or handled while on grounds, by him/her and shall indemnify ETI their officers, employees, and/or all NHS&C show officials, and LAEC against any and all loss; damages and liability thus occasioned including but not limited to any and all legal cost, which may be incurred as a result thereof.
- 11. WAIVER and RELEASE FORMS No one except competitors, trainers, and handlers will be allowed into any of the warm up arenas. All competitors, trainers, and handlers must wear competitor's wristbands any time they are riding in any warm up or show arena. Each competitor will be issued a wristband with their horse show number. Noncompetitors (trainers and handlers) who intend to ride/train/exercise in warm-up arenas must have a signed Waiver and Release form on file in Horse Show office in order to obtain competitors wristbands issued there. There is no charge for the first wristband, and lost wristbands may be replaced at the Horse Show office for \$10.00 each.
- **12. SAFETY** Only official ETI carts on official ETI business will be allowed to go into or through warm up arenas. Spectators, including exhibitors, trainers, and handlers) will NOT be allowed to watch classes from the warm up arenas. There are bleachers and the berm area easily available for spectator use during each class.

- **13. JUDGES** It will be a violation of show rules to commit any act or make remarks during the show that are considered offensive or made with the intent to influence or cast aspersions on the judging, and any exhibitor may be barred from the show for this offense by the arena manager or horse show chairperson. Further, no exhibitor or person shall approach a judge regarding any matter unless he/she first obtains permission from the Arena Manager or NHS&C Chairperson.
- **14. EXHIBITORS and ASSISTANCE** Any participants, trainers, assistants or spectators of the ETI NHS&C shall be considered guests of ETI and must conduct themselves in a moral, ethical manner with good sportsmanship. Any manner or language considered otherwise will NOT be tolerated and violators will forfeit fees, prizes and be required to withdraw from competition and leave the show grounds. This will include harassment, abusive language or intimidation between participants. Harassment of any show official or volunteers by competitors in the ETI NHS&C will NOT be tolerated. All complaints must be brought to the attention of the Arena Manager and NHS&C Chairperson.
- **15. DRINKING** ETI does not allow drinking of alcoholic beverages at any event. If the LAEC food vendor is selling alcoholic beverages, they must be consumed within the lawn area of the food vendor.
- 16. PARKING Exhibitor, spectator, and trailer parking are allowed only in designated areas. NO VEHICLES WILL BE ALLOWED TO PARK IN THE HORSE SHOW OFFICE GROUNDS OR BARN AREA. You may use the barn aisles to load and unload horses/tack only. All vehicles bringing in horses or tack must be moved outside the fence within 20 minutes after entering the barn area. Vehicles left in fire lanes may be towed away. DO NOT BLOCK HORSE TRAILERS or vehicles when parking. Make sure to park only in legal parking areas and in a manner which does not block anyone in. Vehicles parked illegally may be towed away.

SECTION II - HORSE SHOW RULES

- AMATEUR Amateur To Ride (ATR), or Amateur To Show (ATS): a person is an amateur for all competitions conducted under USEF rules who after his/her 18th birthday has not engaged in any activities which would make him/her a professional. A Professional accepts remuneration for riding, driving, showing in halter/in hand, training or conducting seminars.
- <u>NOVICE</u> Open to horses or exhibitors who have not won three or more first place awards in this class prior to the 2011 show year.
- 3. LIMIT CLASSES Exhibitors in Leadline Classes may only show in Leadline. Exhibitors showing in any flat Walk-Trot class or in the 12" (1') Trot Crossrails classes may only show in Walk-Trot classes, Halter, Showmanship in Hand, and Country Pleasure (Walk-Trot exhibitors may not canter in these classes). Horses in Ranch Horse classes may only

show in Ranch Horse or Reining classes.

- <u>GROOMS CLASS</u> Must ride in casual attire (no show clothing), including casual tack that is in good working order; footwear must have heel. This class is designed for those who don't show in any other class. NO TRAINERS.
- BOSALS, SNAFFLE BITS and HACKAMORES Will be allowed in western pleasure classes on Junior Horses (five years old and under) with two hands ONLY. Warning! Since this is not a standard USEF rule, points may be taken away at the judge's discretion.
- 6. **PONIES** Measured at the highest point of the withers shall be 58" (14 hands 2") or less when standing on a flat, even surface.
- 7. NUMBER OF ENTRIES IN A CLASS Five or more entries constitutes a class. Management reserves the right to cancel or combine classes that have less than five entries. Classes which have thirty or more entries will be split, judged and the best five from each section will be judged for awards. One set of awards will be given.
- 8. <u>TIMELINESS</u> It is each competitor's responsibility to present him- or herself to the gate steward when their class is first called for every class in which they wish to compete, and to enter the arena when the class is told to enter.
- **9.** <u>GATES</u> Will be closed two minutes after the class is allowed to enter. Once the gate is closed, the class is closed, judging will commence, and no late competitors will be allowed to enter.
- **10. TACK CHANGE** The gate steward must be notified of tack change request at the start of the class prior to required tack change. Participant should have equipment at the gate and ready to change. There will be a three minute time limit.
- 11. ENTRY NUMBERS Every horse and rider combination entered will be assigned an entry number. Assigned number is restricted to that horse and rider combination only. **No switching of numbers will be tolerated.**
- **12. DISPUTE NOT COVERED BY RULES** Should any questions or disputes arise not covered in the governing rules, the same shall be referred to the Horse Show Committee for decision. Such decision shall be final. Judges decision is final.
- **13. PROTECTIVE HEAD GEAR** All exhibitors riding in English, Hunter, Jumper and Hunt Seat Equitation classes must wear properly fitting protective headgear passing or surpassing current applicable ASTM (American Society for Testing and materials)/SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards with harness secured while riding anywhere on the competition grounds. It is the responsibility of the rider, or the parent/ guardian or trainer of the junior exhibitor to see to it that the headgear worn complies with the appropriate safety standards. Any rider violating this rule at any time must immediately be prohibited from further riding until such headgear is properly in place. All riders in classes where jumping is required and when jumping anywhere on the competition grounds must also wear approved protective headgear.

SECTION III -CLASS SPECIFICATION

- 1. WORKING HUNTER – To be judged on manners, performance, quality, conformation, and soundness.
- 2. HUNTERS UNDER SADDLE To be judged at a walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. Horses may be asked to hand gallop, at the judge's discretion.
- 3. HUNTER HACK To be judged at a walk, trot and canter both ways of the arena and are required to jump two fences and follow additional instructions as given by judge.
- 4. **TROT CROSSRAILS CLASSES** – To be shown at the trot over a course of fences. Riders in classes with fences at a height of 12" (1') may not show in any classes (flat or over fences) which require a canter. Riders in classes with fences at a height of 1'6" to 2' may not show in any over fences classes which require a canter.
- 5. <u>CROSSRAILS CLASSES</u> To be shown at the canter over a course of fences at a height of 1'6" to 2'. Rider may not show in any other over fences classes, except Pony Classes.
- 6. COUNTRY PLEASURE A non-rated class but one of ETI's most popular classes. Open to all breeds and judged as a pleasure class. Class will consist of walk and the horse's favorite gate. However, walk/jog/trot contestants may not canter/lope. Emphasis to be placed on the most pleasurable horse to ride.
- 7. **<u>OBEDIENCE</u>** To be shown at any gait or command the judge calls for (i.e.: trot, hand gallop, side pass, counter canter, etc.) As the judge calls out instructions, horses making errors are brought to the center of the arena. The last horse on the rail wins the class.
- PLEASURE 1ST AND 2ND YEAR GREEN HORSE Is 8. open to green horses in their 1st or 2nd year of showing.
- 9. GAITED BREEDS To be shown at a walk, intermediate gait (acceptable for breed such as a running walk for the Flat Shod Tennessee Walking Horse), and canter/lope in 3-gait classes (or designated gait for specific breed). ETI High Point Class - Gaited Horse Pleasure E/W is walk and designated unique gait only. See Breed Standard handbook.
- 10. HALTER COLOR Is open to color breeds and is to be judged 70% Color and 30% conformation.
- 11. RANCH HORSE CLASSES Horses in Ranch Horse classes may only show in Ranch Horse classes or Reining classes, per High Point Horse Show Circuit Rules.

CONVENTION HIGH POINT – High points will be accumulated over the entire horse show as follows:

1st = 6 points	4th = 3 points
2nd = 5 points	5th = 2 points
3rd = 4 points	6th = 1 point

For any rules not covered here check ETI High Point **Circuit Rule Book, USEF Rule Book, or Breed Standard** Rule Books.




